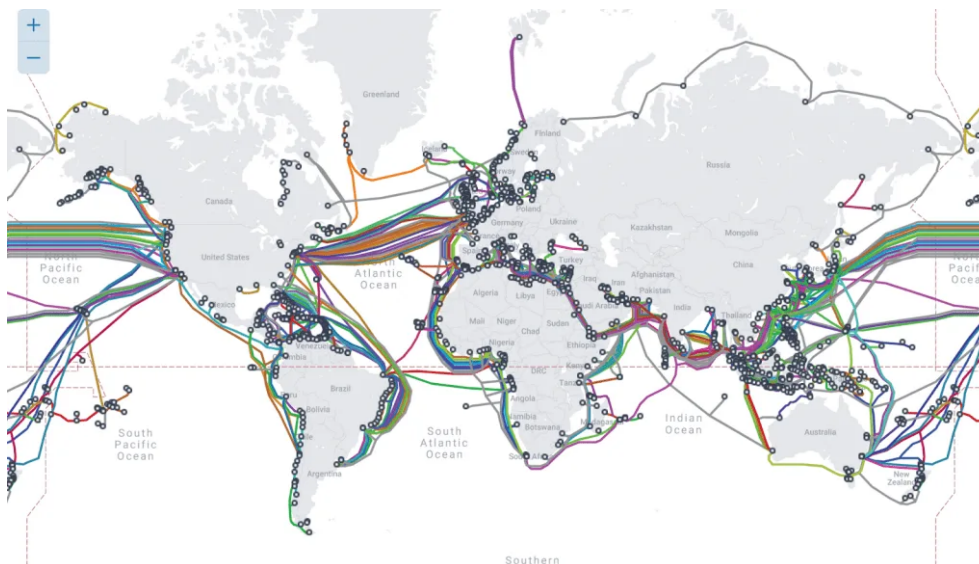
The Nord Stream Lesson and Hormuz Instability

The sabotage of Nord Stream demonstrated that critical underwater infrastructures are the Achilles' heel of Western economies. This awareness is now intertwined with tensions in the Middle East, where the **Strait of Hormuz** has once again become a tool of economic blackmail in the complex conflict between the United States, Israel, and Iran.

While in Hormuz the threat is surface and mining, NATO is increasingly concerned about what happens below sea level: constant monitoring of thousands of kilometers of infrastructure is the only defense against attacks that can paralyze entire nations in seconds.

NATO Strategy: Towards Total Monitoring

The new doctrine of the Atlantic Alliance involves the creation of an integrated surveillance network that utilizes advanced sensors, underwater drones, and artificial intelligence. The goal is to shift from reactive protection to constant **Maritime Situational Awareness**. In this context, Italy has been chosen to host key meetings of the *NATO Maritime Centre for Security of Critical Undersea Infrastructure*, consolidating its position as a logistical and technological hub in the Mediterranean.



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Italian Excellence: Navy and Fincantieri

In this scenario of increased tension, Italian preparedness emerges as a fundamental asset for the Alliance:

1. **The National Underwater Hub (PNS):** Based in La Spezia, the PNS represents the beating heart of Italian underwater innovation. Here, the Navy coordinates technological research among industry, universities, and centers of excellence, ensuring Italy indispensable technological sovereignty.
2. **Fincantieri's Innovation:** The national shipbuilding giant is leading the transition to "Underwater 4.0". With the recent delivery of multipurpose units like Nave Tritone, Fincantieri provides the Navy with platforms capable of operating with underwater drones (UUV) and deep surveillance systems. These ships are not just defense tools, but true mobile laboratories for seabed protection.
3. **International Projection:** Italy's ability to intervene in critical contexts is already a reality. An example is the recent availability of the Navy to deploy non-magnetic units for mine clearance and protection of energy routes, demonstrating that the Italian fleet is ready to respond not only in the "Wider Mediterranean" but wherever energy stability is threatened.

The challenge of underwater security is no longer a matter of pure military defense, but of economic survival. The new NATO strategy provides the political framework, but it is the operational effectiveness of actors like the **Navy** and the industrial capability of **Fincantieri** that transform these directives into real protection.
